With the aim to hone public speaking skills of the students and teach them to be articulate while expressing their thoughts and opinions, SBPS, Ranchi organised the Inter- house Turncoat, Extempore, Declamation and Slogan Reciting competitions on 26th and 27th of April, 2019 for the pupils of grade VI to XII.

For the English and Hindi debate competition, the topics like ‘Religious Institutions Must Pay Taxes’, ‘The UN Should have a Standing Army’, ‘Bandi Par Rok Lagana Aniwarya Hai’, ‘Chini Vastuye Ke Upyog Par Rok Lagana Chahiye’ etc were chosen. The highlight was the questions asked by the rebuttal panel which were aptly answered by the witty and vivacious speakers. In the extempore competition, the pupils of grade VI to VIII participated and they were asked to pick up chits for the topics which were associated with the current issues. For the slogan reciting, the students were given the topic and a time duration of 15 mins to frame slogan on the same.
