The word 'Archaeology' has been derived from the Greek word 'arkhaiologia' which means ancient history.


- Archaeology is the study of the human past using material remains. These remains can be any object that people created, modified, or used. Portable remains are usually called artifacts. Artifacts include tools, clothing, and decorations.
- An archeologist is an expert on history who gains expertise through experience with historical documents and artifacts. An archeologist can assist not only in identifying potential dig locations and the resulting excavations but also in interpreting any artifacts discovered during excavation.



 The study of archaeology involves the investigation and understanding of past human cultures and societies through the analysis and interpretation of material remains. It is an interdisciplinary field that combines elements of anthropology, history, geology, geography, and various scientific techniques. Here are some key aspects of the study of archaeology

- Alexander Cunningham is known as the father of archeology. He founded the Archeological Survey of India (ASI) in 1861.
- Howard Carter (9 May 1874 2 March 1939) was a British archaeologist and Egyptologist who discovered the intact tomb of the 18th Dynasty Pharaoh Tutankhamun in November 1922, the best-preserved pharaonic tomb ever found in the Valley of the Kings.






School subjects can enable students to prepare in this field at Senior secondary level:

- Humanities includes the full range of human thought and creativity, including history, literature, languages, religion, philosophy, music, theatre, and all of the performing arts and visual arts.
- To pursue archaeology as a career, it is advisable to opt for Humanities in Class 11th and 12th. Subjects such as History, Anthropology, and Sociology, etc. build a solid foundation for a career in archaeology.





Types of Archaeology:

- **Prehistoric Archaeology** It focuses on the study of past culture that did not have any written language.
- **Historical Archaeology** It is the study of cultures or civilizations that existed during the period of recorded history.
- Underwater Archaeology It studies the physical remains of human activities beneath the surface of the oceans. It also includes maritime technology.
- Urban Archaeology– Urban archeology is a branch of archeology specializing in large towns and cities with long stratigraphic histories of work. Some archaeologists also use urban archeology to refer to any archeology conducted in urban areas.

TYPES OF ARCHAEOLOGY:

- Medieval archaeology is the study of post-Roman European archaeology until the sixteenth century.
- Post-medieval archaeology is the study of material culture in Europe from the 16th century onwards.
- Modern archaeology is the study of modern society using archaeological methods, e.g. the Tucson Garbage Project.

In India, as a fresher Archaeologist you can expect a salary between Rs.2.5 to 3.5 lacs per year.


Experienced and well-qualified professionals can expect salary packages between **Rs.5 to 8 lacs per annum.**






Challenges faced by the Archeologists
